More than 90 side events, some of them workshops and the Agora Sessions, in which to discuss essential topics: digital transformation, urban environment, mobility, governance & finance and inclusive & sharing cities.

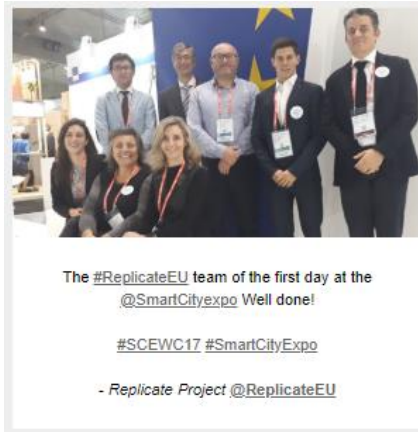
